

THE REALITY OF THE ABORTION INDUSTRY

The case of 3 Abortion Clinics

Abortion clinics and referral centres advertise in their literature that having an abortion is a practically painless, safe and easy procedure, carried out by a professional team who really care about womens' needs.

That is the claim. The reality on the other hand differs dramatically as evidence of malpractice and reports of unsanitary conditions grow steadily, confirming the pro-life belief that abortionists and their staff hold no value on life, be it the unborn child or it's mother.



North England, British Pregnancy Advisory Services

In The People Newspaper, Nov. 1st 1992, there was a traumatic story of a young woman who underwent an abortion at the British Pregnancy Advisory Services Clinic at Parkfield Road in Liverpool, only to give birth to her supposedly aborted baby 48 hours later.

The woman said that she held the tiny baby in her hands before collapsing in distress. "I'll never forget holding that tiny thing - I felt like I was playing God. I was hysterical," she told the interviewer. "I dropped it... and ran screaming down the stairs." The woman claims that she

had wanted to keep the baby but counsellors "pressurised" her into believing that "termination would be best" after she told them the baby's father had left them.

"It was a nightmare," she further explained, "the building was cold and dirty.. I was in a great deal of pain .. I don't want this to happen to anyone else." The People's medical expert Michael Van Straten said "I am horrified at what this lady has been through. She will require long-term counselling."

Miami, Hialeach Inc Abortion Clinic, USA

On the morning of 20 July 2006, Sycloria Williams, age 18, went for an abortion. She has filed a civil lawsuit accusing the clinic staff of delivering her child alive and killing the baby girl by stuffing her into a biohazard bag.

Williams spoke exclusively to the *Florida Catholic* 28 January 2009. She said she is sharing her experience of what happened inside A GYN. of Hialeah Inc. because people "need to know."

Over the first couple of days Williams said that she signed consent forms, discovered that she was 23 weeks pregnant and was given some medications, all without meeting her doctor, Pierre

Jean-Jacque Renelique. She met him two days later, 19 July at *A Woman's Care Inc.* in North Miami. Williams said Renelique gave her a brief, undetailed description of the procedure. "He said that it was a two-day procedure, to take my medicines, and come back the next day," Williams said.

"I asked a lot of questions. I asked like how long it would take, how often they have done this, about the equipment, and what they do with the baby," she said. "They said they freeze the body,"

After their meeting, according to Williams, Renelique inserted laminaria sticks, thin rods of dried kelp that absorb

moisture and slowly dilate the cervix. According to the lawsuit, he also gave her a prescription for Cytotec.

The next day she arrived at the clinic and the surgery proceeded.

What happened next haunts her to this day, Williams said. "It was like everything inside was coming out at once." Williams said she delivered her baby, Shanice, onto the recliner. According to Williams and the lawsuit, the receptionist and the staff began screaming and trying to figure out what to do. Williams said she stood against the wall, staring at her newborn baby. "She wasn't moving much. Twitching, gasping for air. She wasn't crying though, just hissing."

The sight of a fully formed baby was a

complete surprise to Williams. "I thought it was a blob," she said. "They never said anything to me that would make me think it was a baby".

According to the lawsuit, Gonzalez, the clinic's owner, came into the waiting room, cut the umbilical cord, scooped Shanice's body into a red biohazard bag, sealed it and tossed it into a bin.

Hialeah police investigators executed a search warrant at the clinic on 22 July 2006. They found medical records but could not locate the baby's remains. nothing. After a tip-off and another search warrant, the police found the baby's decomposing body in a cardboard box in a closet at the clinic. DNA linked the remains to Williams.

Hazelgrove, Manchester Private Clinic - UK

In a recent Health Department report after an inspection of the Manchester Abortion Clinic in Hazelgrove, no fewer than 27 faults were reported to be found in the clinic. These included dirty conditions in the operating theatre, using unsterilised equipment, and congealed blood on walls and ceilings.

The report also states that health investigators believe the operating theatre is within earshot of the eight-bed ward and that patients can hear what is going on inside as the two are only separated by a set of plastic doors.

Even the operating table is sub-standard as it is extremely old and cracked, making thorough cleaning difficult and the spread of disease likely. The inspector conducting the investigation concluded that assurances could not be given that reused suction pipes or any equipment were being properly sterilised as there was no equipment on site to do the job.

One of the most awful practices reported was that on women being taken past the very equipment that disposed of their aborted babies immediately after they had the abortion.

Babies for Dumping, Wichita, Kansas, USA

Christin Gilbert was a young teenager from Texas who had Down's Syndrome. But despite her disability, she attended high school and graduated from the special education program there.

Her tragedy began when she was sexually assaulted in her small town. Her parents "didn't want" Christin to have a baby, so they took her to George Tiller's clinic.

Christin was in the third trimester of pregnancy. Carhart injected her baby's heart with a poison that would cause it to stop beating. She was told she would "deliver a stillborn"... and was sent back to her hotel room with instructions to call ONLY the abortion mill (NOT a hospital) if something went wrong.

Christin developed complications and returned to the clinic, where they misdiagnosed her condition as "dehydration"... gave her an IV... and sent her back to the hotel room.

As her autopsy later determined, the botched abortion caused Christin to develop a raging infection that had turned into

sepsis, a very serious and often fatal blood infection. Her condition at the hotel continued to deteriorate. She began having episodes of vomiting and unconsciousness. Her family finally took her back to the mill the next morning.

By this time, however, Christin was in serious trouble. According to one doctor who reviewed the autopsy report, she "bled and oozed from every orifice" as she developed a systemic blood disorder that caused her organs to begin to fail. At the clinic, staff finally placed an emergency call to 911—begging the dispatcher to come with "No lights, no sirens!".

The ambulance finally arrived and rushed Christin "code blue" to the hospital—meaning a serious, life-threatening circumstance for the patient. At the hospital Emergency Room, the emergency workers were in a state of "near panic" as they rushed to save Christin's life. But they were too late.

Christin died a horrible, agonizing death at the hands of the staff at the abortion clinic.

These are just a few examples of the real stories behind the murder chambers. There are hundreds of documented cases, in the US alone, of women who died from having a 'safe, legal, abortion'. One of these was a 13-year-old girl named Dawn Revnall who died after having an abortion in New York.
